






ALL COLOURS OF RECYCLING

 <p>Organic and mowing waste</p>	<p>Kitchen waste (including small bones, shells, etc.), tea filters, kitchen roll, plant trimmings and grass clippings.</p>	<p>Liquids, cigarette butts, animal litter tray contents, fats and oils, treated or painted wood and any waste of a non-organic nature (nappies, sanitary pads, etc.).</p>
 <p>Paper and cardboard</p>	<p>Books and newspapers, paper from packaging, cardboard boxes, beverage cartons, clean pizza boxes (without food residue), envelopes, glasses and trays made of paper.</p>	<p>Laminated covers, greasy or dirty paper, oiled or chemical paper, baking paper, plastic cups and plates, paper tissues.</p>
 <p>Plastic and cans</p>	<p>Plastic packaging, bottles, containers, plastic crates and bags, cellophane, plastic cups and plates, polystyrene, tins, crown caps, tin foil, jars, empty aerosol cans (for alimentary or personal hygiene purposes).</p>	<p>All plastic furniture, plastic cutlery, poly laminates such as beverage cartons, jars or tins designed to contain harmful chemical products.</p>
 <p>Glass</p>	<p>Glass containers: bottles, pots or jars for food, glasses, etc.</p>	<p>Light bulbs, glass ceramics, plates and cups, porcelain, pyrex, mirrors, crystal objects, laminated glass.</p>
 <p>Mixed waste</p>	<p>All materials that cannot be sent to the separate recycling collections of waste.</p>	<p>Recyclable waste and everything that can be taken to the Ecological Station.</p>
